## As explorers we will:

Discuss how the children get to school and whether this varies and why. We will make and build simple maps of our local area, thinking about the key features of Ermington. We will explore a range of different types of transport used by the children to get to school and use our maps to navigate around the local area.

As explorers, we will then branch out to the past and explore transport used We will consider why transport has changed over time and what difference this has made to our lives.

We will learn about significant inspirational people from the past who used different types of transport. For example, we will track the

adventures of Amelia Earhart and consider why we still remember her today.

The children will have many opportunities to embed their learning in their play... and we can't wait to share these moments with you on our class DB page!



#### As mathematicians we will:

Expand our awareness of numbers to 20 and beyond. We will also explore shapes, both 3D and 2D. We will

learn how to rotate, manipulate and arrange shapes.

Finally we will focus on visualising and building maps. We will replicate building scenes, describe positions and create our own maps.



#### As artists and designers we will:

Have the opportunity to use a range of tools and materials in different ways to design and create. For example, we will build rockets to take Neil Armstrong to the moon!

## Reading and writing at Ermington

At Ermington, we hugely value the importance of listening to and sharing books. We use every ODportunity to share a book! If you have a book at home that links to our current learning, please share it with the class.

Please read with/to your child every day. This could be reading; the weekly Read Write Inc book, a menu, street signs, a favourite book, or instructions for a Lego creation. At Ermington, we use Read Write Inc to teach phonics. In the summer term, the children in Foundation learn to recognise special friends (two or three letters that make one sound) and read and write using the sounds they have learnt.

Throughout the summer term we will support the children to develop their love of writing, by showing children how to write within their play and supporting them to do this independently.

#### As scientists we will:

Continue to observe and discuss the seasonal change into spring then summer!

We will explore changes in weather, animals, plants and trees.

We will also explore the concept of momentum and use an assortment of materials to experiment with friction.




# As healthy movers we will:


